Thank you for returning your consent forms to assist in the compulsory General Data Protection Regulations exercise. Just over half of members have responded so far.

Contact by Email - Guildry Accounts

For those who have provided their email address in the Consent forms, the intention would be to send the Notice of AGM, previous year's Minutes, List of Charitable Donations and Accounts by email next year. If this is not suitable then please advise Carla Murray and you will be sent a hardcopy. Obviously those Guildrymen who do not have an email address will still continue to have a hardcopy Notice of AGM, previous year's Minutes, List of Charitable Donations and Accounts. The Guildryman newsletter will still continue to be provided by post. Communications can only be sent to those Guildrymen who have provided their Consent to do so.

Guildry Pensions are available for those in need. The pension criteria is as follows:

Applicants must be Guildrymen, their widows, civil partners or unmarried daughters.

Applicants must be resident in the United Kingdom at the time of application.

Applicants' maximum weekly income £200.

Applicants' maximum savings £10,000 (single or couple).

Applicants must be State Pension Age, however pensions may be awarded, on a temporary basis, to applicants under State Pension Age who are unable to work due to disability or who are in extreme financial difficulties.

The granting of a pension is at the sole discretion of the Committee of Management at the time of application. Two members of the Committee of Management may visit the applicants if deemed necessary.

Payments will be made by monthly standing order.

Once awarded, pension entitlement will be subject to review by the Committee. A pensioner may be required to provide the Committee with updated financial details. The qualifying criteria may also be subject to review.
