The Lord Dean's Comments

"I could not have imagined I would be writing to you in the midst of a viral pandemic Covid-19. The Guildry in response to this has had to make operational changes. Our office at 42 George Street is closed however we continue to respond by email and our Secretary/Treasurer Carla Murray is home working."

There have been a few firsts for your Dean and committee. Our first monthly meeting by conference call which went well and will continue until normal service can resume. I also ask that we include in our minutes a coronavirus record of how it has impacted the Guildry and Perth. This I feel will be of interest in the future not only to the Guildry but for future reference as a contemporary account. Another first was our conference call with our accountants to prepare for our AGM.

This has once again been a busy year for the Guildry and committee members. We have had extensive works carried out to the estate and it's continued maintenance. Upgrades of cottages at Hallroom and we have concluded our renovations

at Loanhead Farmhouse. We have also done a full tree survey on the Estate, something which we need to keep under review. Changes in regulations for landlords mean we keep our residential and commercial interests compliant. Atholl Place became vacant after our tenant of almost 30 years relocated. Extensive refurbishment of the property is ongoing and is marketed by Graham + Sibbald. Aberdein Considine our tenants in the High Street have extended their premises to include one of our flats which has changed use from residential to commercial and improved our income.

I have attended a few events including our own Autumn Court of Deans where guests enjoyed the hospitality at Horsecross and a tour of the renovated Perth Theatre. I attended a virtual meeting of the Arbroath Court of Deans where all Guildrys are currently in the same position as Perth. This should have been a celebration of the Declaration of Arbroath 700 year anniversary.

There are many uncertainties ahead needless to say the impact of Covid-19 and Brexit will present challenges for our income. We continue to utilise the best professional advice to safeguard our interests.

Due to the impact of the Coronavirus we have had to
